

Greetings fellow KATA members!

We art therapy faculty at Emporia State University are looking forward to the KATA workshop on ethics presented by Terry Johnston, which is coming up on Saturday, September 12 at ESU! Attached is a map of the campus, which shows your exit off I-35 (Merchant St./Hiway 99) and the quick jaunt to Visser Hall, which is highlighted in yellow. You may park anywhere (purple highlighting is closest) on Saturday without plugging meters or worrying about the color-coded parking signs. The workshop will be on the 3rd floor of Visser Hall in room 330 (breakfast snacks at 8:30 am, workshop from 9 to noon). For those of you who have attended Discovery Day, it is the room where we hold the plenary sessions. There is an elevator in the southeast corner of the building, which is also the corner where the main building entrance is located. At the workshop, we will have available welcome packets from the City which include a brochure with a city map and listings of local restaurants. Several good locally-owned places are downtown, which is just south of campus, including a sushi bar, Chinese, Mexican, BBQ, tea house bakery, bar-and-grills, and coffee shops. Favorite chains like Applebee's, Montana Mike's, and Starbuck's are out west in the other shopping district--just hop back on I-35 and go west one exit to Industrial Rd.

It just so happens that this second Saturday in September is a biggie in Emporia, and we thought you might like to postpone that drive home and check out these fun events!

#### STREET MARKET

On this very Saturday Emporia hosts its annual "Great American Market," a sort of flea market but with some quality goods including antiques and collectibles and really unusual finds at great prices. . . this event attracts a variety of vendors (including food vendors!) from around the midwest and is really fun to browse. If you are an automobile buff, there is also a classic car show. The market is held outdoors on the main downtown street, Commercial St., which runs directly south of campus for several blocks, and is closed off to traffic for the day to make way for vendors and shoppers. On the attached map, you can see Commercial St. emerging at the south end of campus on 12th St.--the event will start right there and goes south for a few blocks. If you prefer to drive you will find parking on side streets and in parking lots on either side of Commercial. The Market closes at 4:00.

#### CHALK FEST

Also on this blocked off street you will find a variety of chalk art paintings, as the Emporia Arts Council holds its annual Chalkfest fundraiser on this Saturday morning. The paintings should all be complete by the time our workshop gets out, but still in good shape for you to see as you browse the market! As usual, many of our art therapy students will be participating in the events this year.

#### INTERNATIONAL FOOD FEST

When the market starts closing down you might return to campus to the lower level of the Memorial Union, which opens out onto a lovely lawn and deck over Wooster Lake with its picturesque bridge and fountain. On the map, you can see the "chicken drumstick"-shaped lake and the Union south of it. From 4 to 7 pm this will be the setting for ESU's annual International Food Festival, which is put on by the international students and various other student organizations. Students from Korea, Saudi Arabia, Taiwan, and Japan have traditionally had a strong representation of marvelous native dishes and treats, and many other nations' cuisines

will be represented as well. Some of the cooking or barbequing is ongoing so you can watch and learn about these foods and cultures. There is no entrance fee, you just pay by the plate or item. Parking is plentiful in the lots across the street east from the Union (Market St.)--again, you may disregard parking meters or color-coded parking areas on the weekend.
